The success of the foundation depends on the contributions of our community and our members. The Watertown Foundation Board of Trustees thank you all for your support and trust ensuring the mission continues for generations to come.

This year the Watertown Foundation, with the support of its members and donors, awarded \$101,000 in Scholarships to thirty-two Watertown students and \$100,000 in grants to thirty-nine organizations.





A donor may support the Foundation's continuing work with an unrestricted gift of any amount. Our donors are individuals, families, businesses, and charitable organizations. Donors may give cash, stock, retirement assets, bequests and other planned gifts.

Designating the Watertown Foundation as the recipient of a *Memorial Donation* continues the memory and spirit of a deceased family member or friend. *In Honor Of* gifts for living relatives or friends in lieu of holiday or birthday gifts can celebrate the event in a meaningful way. *Memorial Donations* and *In Honor Of* donations are received throughout the year. Acknowledgement is sent to the donor and a complete listing of gifts is sent to the family or party.

The Foundation's assets are professionally managed with oversight by the Finance Committee and Board of Trustees.

#### **Trust Funds**

The Watertown Foundation will create a special fund in your name, in the name of your family or business, or in honor of any person or organization you choose. You receive tax benefits in the year your gift is made. Your gift will be placed into an endowment fund that is invested over time, and earnings from the fund are used to make grants addressing community needs. Your gift, and all future earnings from your gift, will provide support for scholarships and organizations helping people and programs in perpetuity. Donors may also leave charitable assets upon their death in the form of a bequest in a will or trust, retirement plan designations, or beneficiary designation in a life insurance policy.

#### Distribution from Named Trust Funds

Each year the Board of Trustees establishes the amounts to be awarded in scholarships and grants, based on the endowment's market value and the success of its investments. This distribution policy strives to maintain the "purchasing power" of the funds over the long term to protect against inflation so that today's assets are not diminished in the future. The Board does not assess fees in the administration of Trust Funds or in the awarding of grants or scholarships.

## Watertown Foundation Centennial Committee

The first meeting of the "Centennial Committee" was held in September 2022. Charged with planning for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Watertown Foundation, we were tasked with three objectives:

- 1. To gain 100 new members by October 2025.
- 2. To award \$100,000 in Scholarships and \$100,000 in Grants in 2025.
- 3. To increase our exposure in the community as we highlight 100 years of philanthropy.

As we celebrate this milestone anniversary, our motto "Connecting our Community through Giving" continues to drive our course. The Watertown Foundation is a circle of giving; the more people who give to the Foundation, the more the Foundation can give to others.

We are happy to report that we have met and surpassed our initial goals!

- 1. We have welcomed 101 new members to our Foundation to date.
- 2. In 2025, we distributed \$101,000 to 32 local scholars and awarded \$100,000 to 39 non-profit organizations, schools, and churches.
- 3. Hosting the six Seward Johnson sculptures from August through October has increased our exposure, and the new Watertown Foundation Centennial Corner will serve as a remarkable reminder of our support to countless individuals and organizations in our past, present, and future.

It was during the 99<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting and Dinner in October 2024 that Linda Merriman, a past president and current trustee, announced a major donation in honor of the Merriman family as founding members of the Watertown Foundation, and their continued support through three generations. The Merriman Family pledged \$50,000 to establish the *Next Generation Fund* to serve as a match with a goal of raising \$100,000 by October 2025. To date, the fund has raised \$58,986, exceeding the goal Linda established! Sincere thanks to Linda and her children, as well as to every donor who contributed to this effort.

## Watertown Foundation, Our Heritage

On October 6, 1925, fifty residents of Watertown met with David Woodward at M'Fingal Inn Bungalow. He informed his guests of his love for the Town and his desire to do what he could to make it a better place in which to live. He had therefore concluded that the organization of a Foundation, incorporated under the laws of the State, should be undertaken for the purpose of receiving and maintaining funds and using the income therefrom to improve the social and living conditions of the town. He explained that he had some experience in the organization of a similar Foundation in Atlanta, Georgia and that six residents of Watertown had pledged \$500 a year as a nucleus of such funds.

He suggested that an opportunity be afforded to each resident of Watertown who was likely to be interested in the establishment of the Foundation to become one of its Charter Members by subscribing to a pledge to contribute to it not less than \$100. By such action all persons subscribing before October 21, 1925 would be declared and forever known as Charter Members of the Foundation. These subscribers would form a temporary organization to function until the Foundation had been incorporated.

All present on October 6, 1925 approved Mr. Woodward's suggestions. Mr. Horace D. Taft was elected Chairman and Mr. John L. Scott, Secretary of the meeting then held by those present. Residents of Watertown were invited to become Charter Members under the plans outlined by Mr. Woodward. A plan of organization at a meeting of the Charter Members was held at the M'Fingal Inn Bungalow on October 21, 1925.

Within a short time, a total of ninety-five residents of Watertown applied for Charter memberships. The Foundation was organized as a Corporation without capital stock on December 4, 1925.

On July 15, 1926, Mr. Woodward made a gift of \$5,000 to the Foundation for the purpose of establishing a Student Aid Fund. He stated that loans should be made from this fund of a reasonable amount to any Watertown student or graduate of Taft School on the basis of scholastic merit, financial need, and contributions to school and community.

The Foundation received \$10,000 from the estate of David Woodward. Mr. Woodward left Watertown as a young man becoming a successful and prominent citizen of Atlanta, Georgia, and he maintained a home in Watertown where he and his family spent several weeks each summer. David Woodward died July 16, 1931.

The Foundation received \$7,475 from the estate of Harley F. Roberts, who died April 29, 1930. He was a long time master at Taft School and was very active in good works in Watertown.

Representatives of the Scovill and Merriman families gave the Foundation the Community House property in 1942. The building and grounds through the years had been the headquarters of many public groups, which were charged only nominal rents by the civic-minded owners. Among the organizations so favored were the Watertown Civic Union, the Red Cross, the Visiting Nurses Association, Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion. The management of this property, which also contained a theatre, stores, bowling alley and a large room for social events, became quite a problem for the Foundation to handle. It was therefore decided to sell the property, which was accomplished in 1950, and from the sale about \$60,000 was received.

Through the years the Watertown Foundation has been the recipient of many generous donations and bequests. As a tax-exempt, non-profit community foundation the Foundation identifies, combines and invests the charitable gifts of its members to benefit the community through supportive grants to non-profit organizations within a 15 mile radius of Watertown, and academic scholarships to graduating community senior students.
